



As Part of MLK Day of Service LENNOX and JAMCO Heating and Air Conditioning Donate New Air Conditioning Unit to Replace One That Was Stolen



On, January 16th, employees from LENNOX and JAMCO Heating & Air Conditioning, Inc. were on hand in Camden to unveil a new air conditioning unit & system, valued at over \$5,000, generously donated by LENNOX after Woodland Avenue Presbyterian Church's old system had been stolen.

In July of last summer, the previous AC unit was discovered to have been stripped down with the unit's copper and the motor being stolen, making the unit unsalvageable. Its primary use was to cool the church's Fellowship Hall during WCDC's after-school program and summer camp. After learning about the theft, Mike Green, Owner of JAMCO Heating & Air Conditioning, reached out to LENNOX on the church's behalf, and the company decided to generously donate a brand new unit.

"The church's Day of Service honoring Dr. Martin Luther King was the perfect opportunity for unveiling the new AC unit," said Rev. Floyd White. "We got to share our excitement with volunteers from LENNOX, JAMCO, Beneficial Bank and others who were on site that day donating their time painting, cleaning and sprucing up the church."
